This difference affects cable performance and may prevent direct substitution in high-heat applications. **Installation Standards:** Both systems comply with standards like BS EN 61537, but their fittings and mounting brackets are often specific to each type . Directly connecting a tray to a ladder without compatible fittings can lead to misalignment or structural instability.
