

Fiber optic patch cord dust cap falls off abnormally



Overview

This occurs when dirt, dust, or other impurities are present on the fiber end-face, leading to increased insertion loss and poor signal quality. Regular cleaning and inspection of the connectors can help mitigate this issue. Fiber optic patch cords are often treated as low-risk consumables, yet a large percentage of optical link failures originate at the patch cord level. Unlike backbone cables, patch cords are frequently connected, disconnected, bent, and handled by technicians, making them the most vulnerable. And then there is the issue of "dust caps. " Within the fiber optic industry, some say that they are called dust caps because they may be filled with dust. Dust caps are molded by the millions, dumped into buckets by the molding machine, packaged and shipped to connector manufacturers in large. Even a dust cover designed to protect the fiber endface can be a significant source of contamination. The truth is simple: dust is the number one enemy of fiber. While dust caps are great at preventing damage to the endface, the plastic used to create dust caps can emit a residue as it deteriorates over time and the surface of the cap may contain mold-release substances used in high-speed production processes.
