Optical Network Terminals (ONTs) and Optical Termination Boxes (OTBs) are primarily designed for fiber optic cable management, splicing, and signal conversion . The main materials used in these boxes include:

- Plastic or polymer housing for durability, impact resistance, and environmental protection .
- Stainless steel or other metals for structural support, mounting brackets, and protective casings .



- Internal connectors and adapters, which may contain trace amounts of precious metals like silver or gold for conductivity and corrosion resistance, particularly in fiber optic connectors and electronic transceivers. The Bidirectional Optical Sub-Assembly (BOSA) inside an ONT, which converts optical signals to electrical signals, may include tiny amounts of silver in solder or contact points, but these are negligible in mass compared to the overall box. In practice, the silver content in a standard residential or small-scale fiber termination box is extremely low, likely less than a gram, and is not a significant factor in the box's weight or recycling value. Most of the metallic content is stainless steel or other common metals, while the optical and electronic components dominate the internal structure. For industrial or recycling purposes, if silver recovery is desired, it would require specialized extraction from connectors or circuit boards, rather than from the bulk of the terminal box. In summary, while silver is present in trace amounts in connectors and electronic contacts, the optical cable terminal box itself contains very little silver, and no standard specification provides an exact measurement.
