

How to get a thick cable into a distribution box

Before starting, turn off the main power supply to prevent electric shock. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) such as insulated gloves and safety glasses. Inspect the cable for damage and ensure the distribution box is rated for the cable size and current load .

Stripping and Preparing the Cable

- Measure and strip the insulation carefully using a cable stripper, exposing enough conductor to reach the terminal block without leaving excess bare wire .
- Clean the conductor to remove any oxidation or debris, which ensures a good electrical connection .
- For multi-core cables, identify and separate each core according to the color coding and the termination schedule.

Choosing the Connection Method

Depending on the cable type and thickness, you can use one of the following methods:

- **Mechanical Terminal Blocks:** Secure each conductor in a terminal block using screws or clamps. This is common for low-voltage distribution boxes and ensures a strong mechanical and electrical connection .
- **Copper Ring or Lugs:** For very thick cables, crimp a copper lug onto the conductor and attach it to the busbar or terminal using a bolt. This provides excellent conductivity and mechanical strength .
- **Heat-Shrinkable Sleeves:** After connecting, use a heat-shrinkable sleeve to insulate and protect the joint, preventing short circuits and moisture ingress .

Installation in the Distribution Box

- Insert the cable carefully into the box, avoiding sharp bends or stress points.
- Connect each core to the corresponding terminal or busbar according to the wiring diagram .
- Tighten all connections securely to prevent loosening due to vibration or thermal expansion.
- Arrange the cable neatly inside the box to maintain “wiring hygiene,” which simplifies future maintenance and reduces the risk of accidental shorts .

Final Checks

- Verify continuity and insulation resistance using a multimeter or insulation tester.
- Ensure proper grounding of the cable and distribution box.
- Close the box securely and restore power, monitoring for any abnormal heating or voltage drops . By following these steps and using the appropriate tools and connectors, you can safely and reliably connect a thick cable into a distribution box while complying with electrical standards and ensuring long-term performance.
