A fiber optic wall socket, also called an optical termination outlet or FTTH outlet, is the endpoint where the incoming fiber cable terminates inside a building. It houses the fiber connector (e.g., SC, LC, or ST) and protects the delicate fiber end-face from dust, bends, and physical damage. The socket typically includes a faceplate, an adapter for the connector, and sometimes a back box to conceal slack fiber and splices. Pre-terminated pigtails link the socket to the ONT or router, providing a clean, plug-and-play connection. Wall sockets come in different types:

- Single-port: For homes with a single fiber service.
- Dual-port: Supports backup or dual services.
- Multi-port (4-8 ports): Used in larger buildings or network distribution points.
- Flush-mounted: Installed within the wall for a seamless look.
- Surface-mounted: Mounted externally, easier to install but more visible.

Fiber Optic Termination Box

The fiber optic termination box (FODB) is a larger enclosure that manages incoming fiber cables before they reach the wall socket. It provides:

- Splicing and distribution: Fusion-splice incoming fibers to pigtails.
- Protection: Anti-vandal and dust-resistant design.
- Cable management: Stainless steel ties and optimized internal structure to prevent loosening and signal loss.
- Mounting options: Wall or rack-mounted for residential, commercial, or industrial use . Termination boxes are designed to support high-speed networks like 10G PON and allow future upgrades to 50G PON or higher. They are built with durable, fire-retardant materials and IP54 protection for indoor and outdoor environments .

Installation Overview

- Mount the back box: Cut a wall opening and secure the box with screws.
- Prepare the fiber: Strip the cable, clean the fiber with alcohol, and cleave it at a precise angle.
- Splice the pigtail: Fusion-splice the incoming fiber to the pre-terminated pigtail inside the box.
- Secure connections: Insert the pigtail connector into the adapter and snap the faceplate onto the box.
- Test the connection: Verify light levels (e.g., -27 dBm to -8 dBm for GPON) and maintain proper bend radius (>30 mm) to prevent signal loss .

Key Considerations

- Connector type: APC (angled) for low reflection loss in GPON, UPC (ultra) for most LANs.
- Dust management: Always use dust caps on unused ports.
- Durability: Choose high-quality materials to prevent signal attenuation and reduce maintenance costs .
- Compatibility: Ensure the socket and termination box match your network type (FTTH, FTTB, FTTO) and future bandwidth needs . By combining a fiber optic termination box with a wall socket, you create a reliable, low-loss interface for your fiber network, ensuring stable high-speed internet and easy maintenance.
