- Ideal for residential, office, or harsh industrial environments where cables need to be hidden or require maximum protection .
- Accessing cables often requires removing covers, making maintenance less convenient than with trays .

Why a Top Cable Tray Is Not a Duct

A "top cable tray" refers to a tray where cables are supported from below, leaving the top open. This open design distinguishes it from a duct, which is fully enclosed on all sides. While a top cable tray may provide some protection from below, it does not offer the complete shielding that a cable duct provides against environmental or mechanical hazards .
