

Safe distance between pipes and cable trays



Overview

When cable trays intersect below pipelines carrying corrosive liquids or above pipelines carrying corrosive gases, the distance should not be less than 500 mm. Additionally, at the intersection, the cable tray should be protected with a corrosion-resistant cover plate, and the. The safety distance between cable trays and pipes is crucial for the effective operation of electrical systems and fluid transport. Failure to maintain sufficient spacing can result in several critical issues that could affect the safety and functionality of the installation. Cable trays should not be installed parallel above thermal pipelines. Industry standards often recommend at least 300mm (12 inches) of spacing between power and control trays to minimize EMI.
