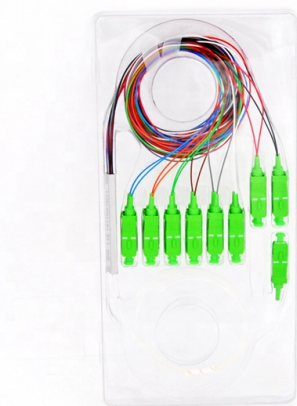


## What is a circuit in a household electrical distribution box



### Overview

North American distribution boards are generally housed in enclosures, with the positioned in two columns operable from the front. Some panelboards are provided with a door covering the breaker switch handles, but all are constructed with a dead front; that is to say the front of the enclosure (whether it has a door or not) prevents the operator of the circuit breakers from contacting live electrical parts within. carry the current from incoming line (hot) conductors to the breakers.

A circuit in a home electrical system is the path that electric current follows from the main electrical panel to devices like lights, receptacles, or appliances, and then returns to the panel via a neutral wire. It typically includes a hot wire (usually black) carrying current out, a neutral wire (usually white) returning current, and a ground wire for safety, which diverts electricity to the earth in case of a fault (HomeTips) . Any interruption in this path, such as a tripped breaker or disconnected wire, stops the flow of electricity, rendering the circuit inactive.

Role in the Distribution Box

The household distribution box (also called a circuit breaker panel, fuse box, or electrical panel) contains multiple circuits, each controlled by its own circuit breaker or fuse. These breakers protect the wiring and devices by automatically cutting off electricity if the current exceeds safe levels, preventing overheating or fire (Everyday Old House) . Circuits can be dedicated for large appliances like ovens, water heaters, or air conditioners, which often require 240 volts, or general-purpose for multiple outlets and lights, usually at 120 volts (The Circuit Detective) . In kitchens or laundry areas, circuits may serve several outlets but are designed with heavier wiring to handle higher current safely.
