

Which terminal should the relay protection test lead be connected to



Overview

It is recommended that the Test Block is always wired with connections to the protective relay or scheme made to the EVEN numbered equipment side terminals. Connections to other equipment, e. CT's, VT's and DC supplies, should be made to the ODD numbered live side. This handbook covers the code of practice in protection circuitry including standard lead and device numbers, mode of connections at terminal strips, colour codes in multicore cables, dos and donts in execution. Abstract—Validating proper current transformer (CT) and voltage transformer (VT) wiring, terminations, and grounding is fundamental to successful performance of the protection system. Occasionally, errors in CT and VT connections can occur, such as missing or broken neutral wires, multiple or. If the CTs are properly connected, there should be no operating current at the relay terminals. Reverse the polarity of one CT. An operational current at relay terminals should be observed to ensure proper sensitivity. Inserting the 3RMLB test plug allows changeover in 3 stages as shown in the timing diagram Figure 1.
